BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Dr. L. Wade Temple, Jr., was born May 11, 1902, in Lake View, South Carolina. His father was Levi Wade Temple, Sr., and his mother was Alice Page Temple.

Brother Temple was married to Miss Sara Lee Pierce of Union Springs, Alabama, November 28, 1930. They have one daughter, Miss Virginia Dean (Ginnie) Temple.

Brother Temple is a member of Bear Swamp Missionary Baptist Church, a member of the Board of Deacons, and Church Clerk.

Brother Temple received his education in the public schools of Lake View, graduating from the High School in 1918. He graduated from The Citadel with a B.S., Pre-Med, in 1924. He attended the School of Medicine, University of North Carolina from 1924 to 1926, and graduated from the University of Maryland, School of Medicine, 1928. His Internship was served in Fairfield, Alabama, 1928-1929; engaged in the general practice of Medicine Lakeland, Georgia, 1930; General Practitioner of Medicine, Lake View, South Carolina, 1931-1950, at which time he retired.

Since 1950 Brother Temple has continued his interest particularly in Masonic and Civic affairs having served as Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Lake View High School, 1952; Supervisor, Dillon Soil Conservation District Supervisors, 1953-1956, and as a member of the Executive Committee, State Association, Soil Conservation Supervisors. He is a member of the Lake View Lions Club.

He was raised in Hillsboro Lodge No. 308, Lake View, South Carolina, April 6, 1932; he is a member of the York Rite Bodies in Florence, South Carolina, and a 32° Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, Valley of Charleston; member of Omar Temple A. A. O. N. M. S., and the Red Cross of Constantine.

Most Worshipful Brother Temple was Master of his Lodge in 1944, District Deputy Grand Master in 1948; elected Junior Grand Warden 1950, and has advanced regularly through the line from that date to the office of Grand Master. South Carolina believes that it is fortunate to have this capable interested and devoted leader, who is often affectionately referred to as the "Country Doctor" as its Grand Master.
