BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Harry Wallace Reid, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry P. Reid, was born May 17, 1926, in Piedmont, South Carolina. He is married to the former Ann Norris of Piedmont and they have two children: Harry Wallace Reid, Jr., age 22, a student at The Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston, S. C.; and Lynda Ann Reid, age 14, a student at McCants Junior High School in Anderson, S. C. The Reids reside at 414 Brook Forest Drive, Anderson, S. C.

Brother Reid was educated in the Piedmont public schools and Clemson University. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Education and a Master of Science degree in Industrial Education from Clemson. He has had further graduate study at the following institutions: Wofford College, Furman University, Stanford University, University of Maryland, and Clemson University.

He is principal of McDuffie High School in Anderson and has been an educator at the following schools: Lindley Junior High School, Greensboro, N. C.; Spartanburg Senior High School; Jenkins Junior High School and the South Carolina School for the Deaf and Blind, Spartanburg, S. C.

He is a member of Central Presbyterian Church in Anderson, S. C.; a Ruling Elder; and adult Sunday school teacher; past president of the Men of the Church of Piedmont Presbytery and past president of the Men of the Church for the Synod of South Carolina. Brother Reid has served as a member of the Board of Visitors for Presbyterian College in Clinton, S. C., and is a past Moderator of Piedmont Presbytery.

He is a veteran of World War II, having served in the United States Marine Corps in the Pacific Theatre. He was wounded on Iwo Jima in 1945 and was awarded the Purple Heart. He is past Commandant of the Owen-Fine Detachment of the Marine Corps League.

Brother Reid is a member of the following professional organizations: Anderson County Education Association,

South Carolina Education Association, National Education Association, South Carolina Vocational Association, American Vocational Association, South Carolina Vocational Director's Association. He is a past president of the South Carolina Vocational Director's Association, a member of the State Standards Committee, and a consultant on Vocational Education for the Southern Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges.

He has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the following civic organizations in Anderson: American Red Cross, YMCA, Anderson Rehabilitation Work Shop. In 1970 he received the Service to Mankind Award given by the three Anderson Sertoma Clubs. He has received the Scroll of Honor given by the Anderson Independent and Daily Mail Newspapers.

A Past Master of Grove Station Lodge No. 166 AFM, Piedmont, S. C., he is a member of the Scottish Rite-Bodies in Spartanburg, S. C., and Columbia, S. C.; Past Venerable Master of the Piedmont Lodge of Perfection; Past Wise Master of the Spartanburg Chapter of Rose Croix. He was coronated 33° Scottish Rite Mason in 1965. He is a member of the York Rite Bodies in Anderson, S. C.; Carolina Conclave Red Cross of Constantine; Royal Order of Scotland; Philalethes Society; Missouri Lodge of Research; Royal Order of Jesters; Hejaz Temple AAONMS. He has been awarded the Honorary Legion of Honor of Demolay for Boys and the Grand Cross of Color from the Order of Rainbow for Girls. He is state chairman of the Committee on Education and Americanism for Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, and the Grand Representative to the State of Arkansas. He has served the South Carolina Grand Lodge as: Grand Pursuivant, Grand Steward, Grand Marshal, Junior Grand Warden, Senior Grand Warden, Deputy Grand Master, and was elected Grand Master of Masons in South Carolina April 26, 1974. In 1972, Grand Master Herbert L. Middleton, Jr., presented the Albert Gallatin Mackey Medal to Brother Reid at the annual communication of Grand Lodge in Myrtle Beach, S. C.
