

For the past several decades, we have asked for a minimum donation of 25 cents per member. Many Lodges currently donate \$1.00 or more per member to the MSA Veterans Hospital Nursing Home Visitation program. Brethren, please consider having your Lodge donate a minimum of \$1.00 per Lodge member to the MSA -Veterans Hospital Nursing Home Program.

I would like to thank every brother in our Grand Jurisdiction for the overwhelming support that you have shown this year for our MSA- Veterans Hospital — Nursing Home Program. I am truly appreciative of the MSA Committee Members and Hospital Visitation Committee Members that have worked tirelessly to ensure that the Veterans of South Carolina have their needs met.
